As per the above provisional balance sheet, the increased income from an additional team as well as the recent increase in league and comp fees mean that we have made a profit overall this season and end the season with approx. £420 in the bank – this was down to £14 at the same point last year so we are heading in the right direction.

9. Report by Secretary

Big thank you for everyone for turning up tonight and supporting the league - i thought that the large attendances in the last 2 years were mainly down to the handicap vote so to see so many people here tonight is just fantastic so thanks you everyone.

I had to check while i was writing this but i make this my third full season as secretary and i genuinely thought that i'd done about 5 so its obviously taking its toll! I've really enjoyed it again and from a league perspective it was a relatively stress free and smoothly run season with very few incidents or dramas. My fellow officers are always tremendously supportive on a week to week basis so many thanks guys. The team captains on the whatsapp group that we have also make running the league really easy so thanks to all of the team captains out there as i know from experience that the teams don't run themselves. Paul Adkin wanted to nominate himself as Captain of the year but given that i don't think we've ever turned up with both a match card and a pen then he still has some way to go to win that award.

We had a huge boost in the close season when Loz from Heald Green got in touch to say that they'd be interested in joining the league. Its fair to say that Heald Green is probably right on the cusp distance wise but the captains group briefly discussed it and we're unanimously positive in accepting Heald Green's entry. Its been an absolute pleasure - its a great club and a really nice set of lads that have been a tremendous

addition to the league and a 4th placed finish shows that they have a lot to offer on the table as well as off it.

Congratulations to Shaw Heath for a fantastic league win - i know you guys tried hard to throw it away in the last few weeks but t the end of the season the league table doesn't lie and the best team over the full 26 weeks has won the league - even if it was by the closest possible margin! Commiserations to Paul Hart and his Morley Green team - runners up for the third year in a row. As i'm sure evryone knows they went into the final game needing a 6-1 victory and they agonisingly lost 2 black ball frames so they were basically 1 ball way from the title. A great effort from those guys to run Shaw Heath so close and i'm sure they'll get that title soon if they keep playing the way they have been. I'd also like to mention Mere A's achievement of 10 straight wins at the end of the season. In the era of handicaps to win 10 games in a row is really special.

Individually, as well as the Heald Green lads we've also welcomed 12 new players to the league this year and i think we're slowly, slowly growing in terms of numbers. In terms of bye players there were 43 times last season when a team couldn't field a full 6 and just 32 this year. That's a big decrease, especially considering there are more matches and weeks this season compared to last. Hopefully that shows that we're on the way up. Next season i would really love for us to get that 14th team - i know that a number of clubs are really close. If you do feel that you're nearly there then reach out over the summer and lets talk about it and see if we can come up with something. I'd be happy for any new team to play fee free next season which would just be them keeping any extra monies that they bring in.

Congratulations to David for another great season of competitions – a lot of effort goes into running the comps - especially the Sunday comps and again, there have been very few dramas or issues. It was great to see the return of the 3 player comp and to be able to have a Sunday comp at Mobberley again is a nice reward for the work the snooker players have done to get the 3rd table back. Many congrats to all of the players who have won things - i won't name all of them now as they'll have their moment shortly but i will congratulate Pete Blain on his brilliant Rotary and TC Jay Double.

Finally - i'd just like to thank each and every player who plays in the league - its your league and you make it what it is - every single player. We used to laugh every year when Tony said the same thing in this speech when he talked about every team being of equal importance whether it be winners Shaw Heath or bottom team Wilmslow B. Having walked in his shoes for a while i know exactly what he means. I also know that everyone plays for different reasons - some people love the game of snooker, some people love the competition and otehrs just want a point with their mates on a Thursday night. I've also learnt from listening to people that there isn't necessarily a link between how good you are and how much you want to win. You could be a 50 handicapper that is desperate to win and sulks when they lose or you could be a -30 handicapper who just enjoys a night out and a couple of frames of snooker regardless of whether you win or lose. Whichever one of those you are closest to, i want to thank you for playing and ask that you come back next year so we can keep this great league that we've got going.
